

Vision Checklist for Preschool Children

During the infant and toddler years, your child has been developing many vision skills and has been learning how to see. In the preschool years this process continues as your child develops visually guided eye-hand-body coordination, fine motor skills and the visual motor skills necessary to learn to read. The following checklist identifies many of the signs and symptoms that are often observed in a child with a vision related learning problem. 	Performance & Behavior
Visual Comfort & Efficiency P T Headaches in forehead or temples Syes hurt, burn, tear or itch Blinks excessively during near tasks Bothered by light Rubs eye frequently Eyelids droop Eye(s) turned in or out at any time Syes in constant motion Covers or closes one eye Turns head to use one eye only Moves head back and forth (instead of moving eyes)	Performance & Behavior P T Short attention span or easily distracted Nervous, irritable, or easily upset Exhibits posture problems Problems with coordination, frequently bumps into things, is clumsy Unable to transfer objects from hand to hand or crossing the midline of the body Visual Processing P T Constantly reverses letters and numbers when reading / writing Transposes letters and/or numbers (12 for 21) Difficulty remembering, identifying and reproducing
Moves objects very close to look at them Avoids near work Unable to see distant objects Lacks interest in looking at objects Squints while looking at objects Complains of seeing double Complains of things looking blurry	geometric shapes Unable to copy simple forms and some letters Struggles with handwriting Avoids tasks visual analysis like puzzles, mazes, and hidden pictures Does not color within lines Is not visually alert and observant of surroundings Does not show visual interest in new objects and places Unable to place small objects in small openings Avoids activities that require eye-hand coordination such as stringing beads tracing,

I-5 checks: Visual problem suspect- Submit checklist to child's teacher for other behaviors seen in class. 6+ checks: Visual problem highly likely- Binocular vision and visual perception evaluation recommended.
